ARE YOUR KIDS COVERED?

*By the Detroit Wayne County Health Authority
Two Options for Health Care Coverage for Children*

Did you know that your children may qualify for **Healthy Kids** or **MiChild**, two free or low-cost insurance programs offered by the State of Michigan?

Healthy Kids is a Medicaid health care program for low-income children under age 19 and for pregnant women of any age. It covers vision, dental and mental health services. This coverage is free for those who meet income requirements. Call United Way Community Services by dialing 2-1-1 for assistance.

MiChild covers regular checkups, shots,

hospital and emergency care, prescriptions, dental, vision and hearing care, and mental health and substance abuse.

If your child qualifies you pay a monthly premium of only \$10. Children must be U.S. citizens, Michigan residents, under 19-year-old, and have no health insurance. They also must meet income requirements. Call 1-888-988-6300 for applications.

Our children are our future. Healthy children do better in school and are happier. Let's help prepare our children for success. Let's get our children enrolled in health insurance programs!

The Detroit Wayne County Health Authority coordinates efforts to meet the health needs of uninsured and underinsured residents in the City of Detroit and Wayne County.

****** ATTENTION ALL ******

In order to keep our streets safe and clear during the snowy days we need your help. Our first bill for snow removal this year was paid. However, snow fund contributions to-date represent just 6.5% of the community. We can only continue to enjoy the benefits of safe, clear neighborhood streets if the remaining 93.5% contribute to the Snow Fund, General Fund and the Radio Patrol. HOW TO REPORT A DRUG HOUSE

In order to report a drug house to the Wayne County Prosecutors office, the following information must be given: What types are drugs are being sold, when are the heaviest hours of the drug activity, are there weapons involved, and are there children around. Also at this number you can report any illegal after-hours activities like night clubs operating with illegal activities serving alcohol after 2:00AM, under-age drinking, houses that solicits prostitution.

Detailed information must be given prior to you reporting these activities such as the type of people who frequent the houses or bars. The height, weight, build, nickname, and other descriptive information. Having this information helps in the prosecution of criminals.

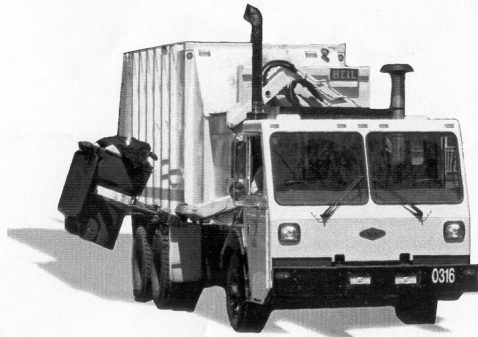

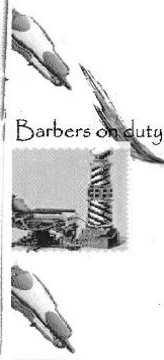

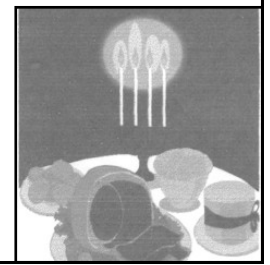
